## Course Credit Waiver Guidelines for Students in the Graduate Institute of Astronomy at National Central University\*

- Article 1 These guidelines are provided in accordance with the *National Central University Credit Wavier Guidelines*.
- Article 2 Master's students who have taken graduate courses offered by the Graduate Institute of Astronomy prior to their admission into the Institute and have received a grade of 70 points or more may apply for a course credit waiver.
- Article 3 Doctoral students who satisfy the abovementioned requirements may not apply for a course credit waiver if credit hours earned from such courses have previously been counted toward the student's minimum graduation requirements for a degree; but if such courses are identical to those required by the Institute, students may apply for a course exemption.
- Article 4 The maximum number of course credit hours that can be waived is 16.
- Article 5 If the waiver is for courses taken from other graduate programs, the application for course credit waivers must be reviewed and approved by the Institute before being put into effect.
- Article 6 Matters not covered by these guidelines shall be conducted in accordance with relevant rules and regulations by the Ministry of Education and the University.
- Article 7 The aforementioned guidelines shall be implemented and entered into force upon approval by a meeting of the Institutional Affairs Committee and appraisal and ratification by a meeting of the Academic Affairs Committee. The same procedure applies to any amendment of these guidelines.
